2 Summary

The aim of the study fund is enhancing the institutional capacity in Uganda in support of the prioritized sectors of the Ugandan-Belgian Cooperation on the one hand and the preparation of the Indicative Development Cooperation Program and the implementation of the Paris Declaration on Aid Effectiveness on the other hand.

The study fund supports development cooperation activities in areas of:

- Strategic analysis in the context of the priority sectors of the Belgian cooperation in Uganda;
- Studies, missions, seminars, and training programs with regard to integration of transversal themes (gender, environment, child rights) in the sector programs and development projects or programs;
- Preparatory studies in the context Belgian-Ugandan indicative development cooperation program; and
- Activities in support of the implementation of Paris Declaration on Aid Effectiveness.
- Identification studies related to development projects or programmes;
- Consultancies and missions (short term expertise) of less than 12 months related to preparation and implementation of development projects and programmes;

2.2 Key elements

The education and health sectors that the Belgian cooperation supports are among the most important sectors of government of Uganda next to Energy and infrastructure. The study fund has continued to support the two sectors in developing strategic documents including policies, strategic and investment plans. All the studies are highly aligned to and is strengthening GoU national development strategies, institutions systems and procedures.

From 2010, the Study Fund started exploring opportunities for collaboration and coordination with other development partners which materialised in 2011. Through co-funding approach, two important studies have been financed. These include development of BTVET strategic plan together with World Bank and development of climate change policy together with DANIDA, World Bank and World Food Organisation.

This project is designed to strengthen the capacities of the beneficiary institutions enabling them to produce quality documents that will enhance policy decision and attract further funding. Some of the important studies that have been developed under study fund have gone through faster cabinet approval processes and there is significant increase in national budget provision in the sub sectors.

For quality control, BTC is using more and more the sector advisors to provide technical support in the whole process right from the start, during the review of proposals and terms of reference, to implementation.

2.3 Key Risks

Studies that are cross cutting different sectors /sub sectors or ministries if

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well coordinated and all stakeholders brought on board leads to higher degree of success but may also face challenge of struggle for ownership.

Teaming up of individual consultants though leads to stronger team, coordination can be a challenge if the team leader is not strong. In addition, sequencing of the different team member's input in the overall study can be difficult.

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3 Analysis of the intervention

3.1 Context

To improve and accelerate the implementation of the Ugandan-Belgian Cooperation, as well as to promote evidence-based policy inputs and programming in the development cooperation, in 2002 the Government of Uganda and the Government of the Kingdom of Belgium created Belgo-Ugandan Study and Consultancy Fund. Since 2008 the fund concentrates its studies and consultancies in the sectors of health and education. The scope of the fund was extended to include also short term expertise for these two ministries and for the Ministry of Finance, Planning and Economic Development for activities related to the implementation of the Paris Declaration in Uganda.

3.1.1 Evolution of the context

The study fund has continuously been used for co-funding important studies through cooperation with other development partners. This cooperation has proved to be very fruitful both technically and financially.

The study fund has been used to support studies within the development cooperation programmes leading to formulation of new projects, baselines and final evaluation of projects. More and more sector/sub sector strategic plans for the partner countries are being developed with support from the fund. These plans will be helpful during the preparation of new indicative cooperation program.

3.1.2 Institutional Anchoring

Institutional anchoring score: very appropriate

The study is co-managed by MoFPED and BTC who are responsible for approving the fund request with no objection from the Belgian Embassy. Requesting line Ministries or government Agencies together with BTC are in charge of the execution of the different studies.

3.1.3 Execution Modalities

Execution modalities:

The organisational and execution modalities of the project are based on the co-management (Cogestion) model, as established by the Specific Agreement, whereby MoFPED and BTC are the implementing partners.

In addition to being involved in procurement of consultants, administration and day to day management of the fund, BTC as the fund Co-Director, is responsible for the Belgian approval of Study Proposals. The proactive involvement of BTC and MoFPED in reviewing the draft proposals has reduced the time lag between submission and approval of study proposals. The numbers of proposals being rejected either due to poor quality or not fitting with the objectives of Study fund have equally reduced.

The Line Ministries are taking active role during the implementation of the studies as supervising officers and this has lead to increase in the pace of completion of studies.

For quality control, BTC is using more and more the sector advisors to provide technical support in the whole process right from the start, during the review of proposals and terms of reference, to implementation.

The Steering Committee of the project, was set up at the start of the project to ensure the orientation, control and follow-up of the project. The Steering Committee is mandated to inter alia, monitor and where necessary offer technical advice/assistance; and to act as liaison between key beneficiary government line ministries and agents. The steering committee comprises of MoFPED, BTC and Ministry of Foreign Affairs with Belgian Embassy as invited party. The inconsistence of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs in these meetings has created a gap in their contribution to the committee. In addition the irregularity of the steering committee is causing delays in taking some decisions related to the fund.

Harmo-dynamics

The education and health sectors that the Belgian cooperation supports are among the most important sectors of government of Uganda next to Energy and infrastructure. The study fund has continued to support the two sectors in developing strategic documents including policies, strategic and investment plans. All the studies are highly aligned to and is strengthening GoU national development strategies, institutions systems and procedures.

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From 2010, the Study Fund started exploring opportunities for collaboration and coordination with other development partners which materialised in 2011. Through co-funding approach, two important studies have been financed. These include development of BTVET strategic plan together with World Bank and development of climate change policy together with DANIDA, World Bank and World Food Organisation.

By design, there is a significant degree of ownership in the study fund. The fund is implemented in a co-management. The Deputy Secretary to the treasury, MoFPED is the Fund Director, while the BTC Resident Representative is the Co-Director, together with the beneficiary institutions they are jointly responsible for the implementation of the study fund. MoFPED has a good overview of the fund and plays a strong leadership role in managing and implementing the study fund, which strengthens the ownership.

The majority of studies being financed are well integrated within the institutions' mandate and portfolio to bridge the gap in the policies, strategies, investment plans or processes. The study fund has also been used to operationalise government policy and draw up strategies for implementation, the case of BTVET strategic plan.

This project is designed to strengthen the capacities of the beneficiary institutions enabling them to produce quality documents that will enhance policy decision and attract further funding. Some of the important studies that have been developed by study fund have gone through faster cabinet approval processes and there is significant increase in national budget provision in the sub sectors.

The study fund has also supported the development or improvement of government systems. With the active involvement of government during the implementation of the study, their capacity in using the procurement systems are being strengthened.

Lastly the approval of the proposals and administration of fund is being spearheaded by MoFPED. The steering committee is chaired by representative from MoFPED and other members include Ministry of foreign Affairs, BTC and Belgian Embassy is invited.

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3.2 Specific objective

3.2.1 Indicators

The set up of study fund did not require an operational technical and financial file to be developed. It therefore lacks logical framework. The design of study fund does not warrant a baseline survey. It involves a series of studies, for which each study a detailed proposal, terms of reference with estimated budget is developed. It is against the proposals and budget in line with the specific agreement that the implementation is based.

Specific objective: Enhancing the institutional capacity in Uganda in support of the prioritized sectors of the Ugandan-Belgian Cooperation on the one hand and the preparation of the Indicative Development Cooperation Program and the implementation of the Paris Declaration on Aid Effectiveness on the other hand.

3.2.2 Analysis of progress made

Proposals are generated by beneficiary institutions to target specific area of interest for which these institutions lack technical capacities. It is well integrated within the institutions' mandate and portfolio to bridge the gap in the policies, strategies, investment plans or processes. Some of the major achievements for the year were the finalization of BTVET strategic plan and start of formulation of climate change policy and implementation startegy. The BTVET strategic has already been approved by Cabinet and preparations are underway to start implementation. It also expected that with this strategy more donors will pick interest in BTVET and provide additional funding e.g World Bank. Since this strategy focuses on skills development which is one of the elements in theme of National Development Plan (NDP) "Growth, Employment and Socio-Economic Transformation for prosperity" Government budget for this subsector is equally expected to gradually increase.

Most of the studies of 2011 are strongly complementary to the Belgian Cooperation portfolio in Uganda with 50% in education and 20% in health and 30% other sectors.

3.2.5 Potential Impact

Through the studies conducted under this project, the ministries and government agency are able to access additional funding for priority activities where there is shortfall within government budget. Through direct involvement during the implementation of the studies capacity has been built. With the strategies in place, ministries are equipped for negotiation with MoFPED and development partners for more funding.

The study fund was used to produce a comprehensive BTVET sub-sector strategic plan for Ministry of Education and Sports that will inform policy

makers and bring together all the BTVET stakeholders in Uganda. Skills development is one of the important elements in the National Development plan (NDP). The BTVET strategic plan will support the implementation of BTVET act of 2008. This document will guide development of BTVET in Uganda to be able to compete within the region and globally.

3.3.3 Analysis of progress made

Eleven studies have been completed successfully. Five are ongoing and out of these one (Aid management manual) is facing challenges and should be halted. Two new studies (climate change policy and child protection strategy) are at inception phase. One (evaluation of study fund) was approved towards the end of the year and is at tendering stage.

Until this reporting period, two studies that were carried forward from 2009 remained a challenge to finalise;

<u>Energy Study</u>: Draft report was submitted and approved in 2010 and it took another six months for final report to be submitted and approved by MoFPED. This study was initially supposed to be conducted within a period of nine months but instead took three years to be completed. The risk is that this study may have been taken up by events and the data and recommendations may no longer be relevant. However, it has now been finalised and we are yet to know how the recommendation from these studies would be carried forward.

<u>Study to review the Aid Management Manual</u>: The steering committee that was held in July 2011 advised to halt the study due to serious delay and new development surrounding aid effectiveness. This means if this study is to continue there is need to reconsider adjustment of the current TOR.

The inception phase for climate change policy development was conducted from 12th to 16th December 2011. The study will be conducted by a team of eight consultants and is expected to be completed by October 2012.

The development child protection strategy started with inception phase and has started with the consultative process. However, the changes in management within the Directorate where the study is anchored in Uganda Police Force may cause risk to the implementation of the study. It is hoped that Fund director and Co-Director will support the implementation of the study.

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Artemia study has progressed successfully and workshop for presentation of draft report was held in December 2011. The final report of the study has been submitted and approved by MAAIF and MoMU.

Cost assessment study: Setting up team of consultants was a challenge due to differences in availability to start on the assignment. Contract for international consultant took more than a month to be signed. Data collection was equally a challenge due to sensitivity of the required information. However, notwithstanding all the above the draft report was submitted in September 2011 and final report in October 2011.

3.3.6 Budget execution

The implementation of study fund has progressed smoothly. By the end of December 2011, the financial realisation for the year was at 104%. Overall budget execution is at 64%.

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In the year 2011 a total of 10 studies was allocated fund worth Euros 1,008,935 out of these Euros 867,390 was planned to be spent and by the end of the year 104% of the planned expenditure had been utilized. Considering the current progress in implementation it is possible that by the end of the current specific agreement the implementation rate of the study fund should have reached 100%. During the previous years the utilisation of fund was quite slow i.e. few studies being approved and implementation stagnating.

4 Transversal Themes

Transversal themes have been integrated into some studies as appropriate during the development of sector strategies. In future there should be deliberate effort made to integrate transversal themes in all studies as appropriate right from inception to the outcomes.

4.1 Gender

Some elements of gender have been integrated into the studies. In addition, the constitution of a reasonable number of females in several studies is an indication that the contracting authorities are perceived as non-discriminative on the basis of gender.

4.2 Environment

Environmental concerns have been only considered in studies that have direct relationship with environment ignoring that fact that environmental issues are crosscutting in all sectors.
